It's our privilege to welcome you to the Malvern Cube 2022/23 annual review. We are an independent community and arts centre which is community-led and run, and our role as trustees is to provide a place for the local community to use.

We have inclusive and affordable spaces which people can hire for meetings, clubs, support groups and activities, to put on theatre, music events and festivals or where they can just drop in to enjoy a warm welcome in our lovely gardens or café.



We have to find our own running costs so we rely on generous help, donations and support from local people and organisations to balance the books and to keep costs down for our users. Our small staff team is helped by our wonderful volunteers who support us with every part of Cube life.

Ten years ago Malvern Cube was saved from closure by the local community and today it is thriving. It's a space where everyone, regardless of age or ability, can find friendship, creative activities, fitness, entertainment and support: a much needed heart in the centre of the community.

Our values and vision

Our 3-year Strategic Plan sets out what we hope to do and how we will do it. One of our key aims has been to develop and support the arts at the Cube so we also have a **Performing Arts Plan**. These plans are our roadmap for realising our vision for Malvern Cube.



A look back on 2022/23



We celebrated the Cube's tenth
birthday with a giant cake and a
free Ceilidh for staff, volunteers,
supporters and users. A brilliant
time was had by all and it was a
great opportunity to reflect on just

how far the Cube has come since local people saved it from closure.

Over 50 groups used the Cube for meetings and activities ranging from dog training, painting, church services and exercise classes. They ranged in age from tiny babies to 100-years-plus and came from right across the Malvern community.



Our three resident theatre groups put on performances by and for people of all abilities and we hosted an amazing Festival of Equality. Strange Futures premiered **Slow-Cooked Stories**, a performance developed with local professionals and community groups - to great acclaim.

We launched our '**Give Us A Lift!**'
crowdfunding campaign. Just six weeks
later we had pledges for the £40,000 we
needed to put in a lift to connect the
top and bottom levels of the Cube.
What an amazing result!

It was great to see the Cube being used for fundraising events. One of the highlights was a **ceilidh**, raising an amazing £3,000 for Ukraine. Charity card and craft sales in the café were also really popular.

We provided space each week for Cube Youth to run their amazing youth club and wide range of activities for young people, including during school holidays.

We welcomed a new café
manager to the Garden Café.
A new menu with affordable
healthy meals and new
volunteers made it a welcoming
space for the local community to enjoy. We
served **over 4,400** healthy lunches and **over**7,700 drinks.

Our volunteer team grew to 17.
These wonderful people came in each week to help in the café and office and with events. We hosted comedy, dance, folk and rock, theatre and storytelling and they became expert in setting up, bar work and stewarding.

We took a long look back at the Cube, talking to local people about its early life as a youth centre and place for music and gigs. We gathered these together and used them and old photos to put together our 'Cube Memories' exhibition and online archive.


Cube improvements



Finance


2022 saw us moving out of the turbulent times of the pandemic, but, as a self-funding organisation, it was a challenging year.
